## Tetons Schedule

Now that travel arrangements are pretty much settled, the highest priority of the Tetons Expedition Planning Committee is to firm up the schedule of events so that we can make final reservations, and so that the leaders of the various outings can begin detailed planning. Please review the schedule of activities below, choose those you wish to participate in, fill out the form on the next page, and return it to Shirley Morris.

Some of the outings have size limits, and will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis, with the understanding that Scouts and adult leaders will get first priority for spaces. There is space for everyone on the raft trip (and we hope everyone will come!), but there are three kinds of seats (scenic, whitewater rowed, and whitewater paddled) which will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Please understand that any youngster who is not a registered Boy Scout must be accompanied by a parent on all activities.

**Hanging Canyon.** Take a moderately strenuous hike to a spectacularly beautiful alpine area. No training or climbing skills are necessary. We may divide into more than one party, grouped by experience.

**Yellowstone National Park Geology Tour.** Follow geology professor Page Chamberlain on an auto tour of the southern two thirds of the park and learn about the geologic origins of geysers, mud pots, Yellowstone Falls, and Yellowstone Lake. No training or skills necessary.

**Snake River Rafting.** Choose the scenic raft trip, the whitewater guide-rowed raft, or the whitewater paddled raft. One whitewater raft will be paddled by us and steered by a guide and the other is rowed by a guide. The scenic raft is rowed by a guide on a calm stretch of river rich in scenery and wildlife.

**Swan Lake and Heron Pond Loop.** Get up early for an easy 3-mile hiking loop where we can see moose and trumpeter swans.

**South Teton.** Michael Ward will lead a challenging, three-day backpacking trip with the primary objective of a non-technical climb of the South Teton. Anyone planning on this trip should go on the troop backpacking trip on July 11 as preparation.

**Cascade Canyon.** Cross Jenny Lake by boat and then follow the easy hiking trail into scenic Cascade Canyon as far as the mood takes you.

**Grand Teton.** The Tetons Venture Crew is planning to climb the Grand Teton by the famous Owens-Spaulding route. In order to complete this climb you must be registered with the Venture Crew and have completed all the training prescribed for the outing.

**Canoeing on Jackson Lake.** We'll have a group decision on where to go on Jackson Lake, the large lake near our campsites at Colter Bay..

**Horseback Trip.** We'll head off into the woods on horseback for two hours.
